WHEREAS, on January 19, 2023, the Albany County Planning Board deferred the proposed local law to local consideration and responded that the proposed local law would have no significant countywide or intermunicipal impact; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board duly noticed and held a public hearing on the proposed local law on January 12, 2023; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to SEQRA, the Town Board has prepared and completed Parts 1 and 2 of the Full Environmental Assessment Form (FEAF) and duly reviewed the FEAF and considered the criteria contained in 6 NYCRR §617.7(c) to determine whether the proposed action will have a significant impact on the environment; and

WHEREAS, on January 26, 2023, the Town Board adopted a Negative Declaration with respect to this action; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Coeymans hereby adopts Local Law No. 1 of 2023 in its entirety, a copy of which is attached hereto. The Town Clerk is authorized to sign all documents and perform such actions necessary to effectuate the adopting and filing of the new local law with the New York State Office of the Secretary of State.
