Resolution Adopting Local Law No. 2 of 2023, a Local Law to Provide Real Property Tax Exemptions for Volunteer Firefighters and Ambulance Workers Pursuant to NYS Real Property Tax Law Section 466-A

I, Council member McHugh offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

WHEREAS, the Town Board has introduced Local Law No. 2 of 2023, entitled a "Local Law to Provide Real Property Tax Exemptions for Volunteer Firefighters and Ambulance Workers Pursuant to NYS Real Property Tax Law Section 466-A; and

WHEREAS, under the proposed local law eligible fire and ambulance volunteers may apply for a 10% property tax exemption subject to certain limitations set forth in said local law; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board duly noticed and held a public hearing on the proposed local law on February 23, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the enactment of this local law is a Type II action pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, 6, N.Y.C.R.R. 617.5 as it involves agency administration, management and legislative decision making that does not affect the environment or commit the Town to a future decision on a project, and therefore is exempt from environmental review; and

WHEREAS, the Board has duly considered the proposed local law and public comment thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Coeymans does hereby pass, approve and adopt Local Law No. 2 of 2023 in its entirety, a copy of which is attached hereto, and the Town Clerk is authorized to sign all documents and perform such actions necessary to effectuate the filing of the local law with the New York State Office of the Secretary of State.
