Old Business:

Town Hall Mold Remediation: Supervisor McHugh gave a brief history of this issue. Matt Fueston from MJ Engineering spoke regarding the assessment recently completed. Overall, the excavation showed no major issues. There were various places where the mortar had been eroded. It is being proposed that excavation should take place fully down the west and the south sides of the building to install an external drain tile system and run it out to daylight or connect to the existing storm water. Additional waterproofing around the outside of the wall and regrading of the land to divert water will be needed as well.. Supervisor McHugh asked when an estimate would be ready. Mr. Fueston said it would take about a week. Supervisor McHugh feels it may be a good option to have a public hearing for people to help decide what should be

done with Town Hall. Supervisor McHugh stated in his conversations with Mr. Dooley of MJ Engineering the potential costs could be anywhere from three hundred thousand to five hundred thousand to get just the outside of the building sound.

Public Comments:

Darlene Mergendahl of North Clement spoke in regards to the numbers of attendance for the Mosher Park Pool in 2021. She states this is the report she handed in to the village offices and

will give the Supervisor a report at the end of the meeting. Mrs. Mergandahl gave numbers for the summer of 2019. The pool was open for 69 days. The following number of residents used the pool: 4,324 village, 1,004 Town, 755 out of Town. In 2020 due to COVID limited the pool use. 241 passes were given out, 163 were village and 78 were town residents. A copy of the report was given to the Supervisor. She is here for her love of the community and feels for those families and seniors that cannot afford to pay for a pool pass.

Henrietta Swain lives in the hamlet of Coeymans. Ms. Swain feels that the kids in the hamlet would benefit from having the pool as an outlet for activity. She feels it could deter their mischief but unfortunately their parents cannot afford to buy a pass.

Robert Gunther lives on Lindskoog road. Mr. Gunther and his wife lived in the village and chose to move to Coeymans Hollow due to the number of kids trespassing on their property, causing damage and harassing their dog within the village. His vehicle was vandalized at Coeymans Landing Park while he and his family were on the river recently. He expressed frustration that this damage occurred while in eye sight of the Albany County Sheriff's substation. Over four thousand dollars' worth of damage was estimated to have been done to his truck. He is requesting the town look into high-definition security cameras and improved lighting for boaters using Coeymans Landing. The Chief of Police stated this is an active investigation and due to the level of damage it is considered felony criminal mischief. In the event this is a juvenile, it will have to go to family court and the parents will be responsible for the damages. Supervisor McHugh stated we are in the process of getting pricing on cameras.

Council member Tutay expressed her thanks to all those who held the 350th celebration together.
