WHEREAS, the Town of Coeymans continues to implement the improvement of our town parks and local historic sites and has determined that the Valley Paper Mill Park would benefit from such improvement;

WHEREAS, grant funding through the Albany County Municipal Park Improvement Initiative Grant has been made available for municipalities to improve, develop, and enhance parks and recreational facilities in Albany County;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Town Board of the Town of Coeymans does hereby authorize the Town of Coeymans, in collaboration with the Alcove Preservation Association, to pursue possible grant funding for the rebuilding of the chimney capital at the Valley Paper Mill town park.

#### **Public Comment:**

Tom Sweeney is the President of the Alcove Preservation Association (APA). He explained the grant would be used to restore the decorative top of the Chimney if awarded. Mr. Sweeney will be writing the grant himself.

Doris Millett lives in Alcove. She is in favor of the new building and feels it is needed. Ms. Millett stated she feels the project is vague at the moment. Supervisor Donnelly stated Ted Marbaker from MJ Engineering is working on 2 drafts of plans for the Town to see. There will be a 2-week period to review the plans. The Town Clerk stated the plans will be available in the Clerk's office for public viewing on received. Mrs. Millett asked for clarification on if all the buildings were being purchased, the answer is yes. The current resolution states that permissive referendum is not necessary due to the money being used to purchase the property being surplus funds. Any surplus funds are accumulated taxes and she feels the decision should be made by permissive referendum considering taxpayer monies are involved. She asked about the use of the outer buildings and council member Stott told her the outer buildings would be modified to hold records, and possibly an impound building for the police. She stated that the current shelving in records storage was procured by her via grant many years ago but due to the flooding issues it was hard to get the state to fund much for this building after that. Mrs. Millett asked about the NYCLASS investment in which town attorney Reilly explained to her. She stated during her time the town wasn't allowed to invest in such a way and asked about the fees related to this type of investment. She asked how many people would be allowed to have access to these funds. The Town Attorney stated he believes those in the business office that could currently move money would have access. Mrs. Millett feels as though the Town Board should have to approve by resolution any funds taken from the investments. Mr. Reilly believes the money can only be deposited in certain accounts as well. Mrs. Millet stated she agrees with what Danie Baker said regarding the investments during the July 25th meeting.

Barbara Tanner live on Ridge Road in Ravena. She asked council member Schmitt if he was okay with the NYCLASS investment since he voted no. He replied that he is not in favor of this investment plan in any way. Mrs. Tanner asked if a cost was determined for the new building yet. Supervisor Donnelly said we will need to see the plans in order to get an accurate estimate.

Council member Hotaling said he feels this potential town hall should be significantly less than the new one that was proposed a few years ago. He feels this is the best way to go and doesn't think any work should be done to 18 Russell ave.
